A. RULES OF LAW QUIZ

- 1. Each Team shall comprise of two participants.
- 2. There shall be only one team from one college.
- 3. The preliminary round shall be in the written form.
- 4. The questions shall be in the form of multiple choice, true/false statements, specific answer based etc.
- 5. Team scoring the highest marks in the written quiz shall qualify for the final round.
- 6. Quiz will cover topics related to:
 - a) India and its international Relations.
 - b) Amendment Bills relating to constitutional and criminal laws. (From the year 2000 to 2016, inclusive.)
 - c) Current Affairs.
 - d) Case laws mentioned below for Case Law Round.
 - 1. K.M. Nanavati v. State of Maharashtra (1962 AIR 605)
 - 2. Maneka Gandhi v. Union of India (1978 AIR 597)
 - 3. Keshavananda Bharti v. State of Kerala ((1973) 4 SCC 225))
 - 4. M.C. Mehta v. Union of India (1988 AIR 1115)
 - 5. Mohribibi v. DharmodasGhose ((1903) 30 Cal 539)
 - 6. Shreya Singhal v. Union Of India (AIR 2015 SC 1523)
- 7. The guiz shall be conducted within a span of 2 hours.

B. SEQUENCE

The sequence of rounds shall be as follows:

I. Screening Session (written)

- ➤ There are **60** Multiple Choice Questions in the Preliminary written round. (1 marks each)
- > Time duration for Preliminary round is 1 hour.
- Total 60 marks (1 mark for each Correct Answer) shall be awarded for the preliminary round.
- > On the basis of merit, 5 teams shall qualify for the final round.
- 2. After the Preliminary round, test copies will be checked and the result for the teams selected for the final round will be declared.
- 3. Teams cannot ask for the preliminary answer copies of another team.

II. Final Session (Duration 2 Hours)

This session shall comprise of four rounds which shall be as follows:

A. FirstRound

- 1. 5 questions shall be put up per team.
- 2. 30 Seconds shall be given for giving the answer.
- 3. 10 mark for each shall be awarded for the correct answer and 5 marks shall be awarded for the bonus question.
- 4. The question shall pass only once to the next team.

B. Case law Round

- 1. Rules similar to round I.
- 2. The participants shall pick up a case law through draw of lots based upon which question shall be put forward relating to the case law picked up by the team.
- 3. Five questions in a sequence shall be put before a team which they need to answer within a span of 30 seconds. In case of failure, the question shall be put before the audience.

- 4. The case laws shall be amongst the following:
 - i. K.M. Nanavati v. State of Maharashtra (1962 AIR 605)
 - ii. Maneka Gandhi v. Union of India (1978 AIR 597)
 - iii. Keshavananda Bharti v. State of Kerala ((1973) 4 SCC 225))
 - iv. M.C. Mehta v. Union of India (1988 AIR 1115, 1988 SCR (2) 530)
 - v. Mohribibi v. DharmodasGhose ((1903) 30 Cal 539)
 - vi. Shreya Singhal v. Union of India (AIR 2015 SC 1523)
- 5. Either draw of lots or top scorer will be given chance to select the topic.

C. Audio Visual Round (Buzzer Round -15 Clippings)

- 1. The teams shall view the screen for the visual question or listen to the audio clipping and then provide the answer.
- 2. The respondent, who presses the buzzer the earliest, shall answer the question otherwise, the question shall be put before the audience.
- 3. Other rules are similar to round I.

D. Rapid Fire Round

- 1. Questions shall be put up before the teams within a span of **one** minute.
- 2. The question shall not pass to the next team.
- 3. The respondent has to provide the answers in quick succession.
- 4. Each Question shall be of 10 marks.

PRIZES
